
If you could rewrite the beginning / ending / any part of the story, I would make the following changes:

Name one or two characters in the book that impress you most & state the reasons why the character impresses you.




If you could rewrite the beginning / ending / any part of the story, I would make the following changes:



IS CLIMATE CHANGE AFFECTING MARINE BIODIVERSITY?

Along with the intensification of climate change, marine biodiversity is being threatened.

Coral reefs are playing a major role in preserving marine biodiversity. Seeing that numerous structures of coral reefs contain myriad caves, incredible coral reefs can provide not only fantastic places for marine organisms to reproduce, but also habitats for them to live. Therefore, one of the most important consequences of maintaining marine biodiversity is coral reefs.

However, the lives of coral reefs have been impacted adversely by climate change which is harmful to sea creatures. The way how climate change influences coral reefs and threatens marine biodiversity is as follows.

To commence with, marine biodiversity is under the threat of climate change by means of the increasing temperature. With the deterioration of Greenhouse effects, the Earth is getting warmer and warmer. Gradually, coral reefs cannot live at the most proper temperature since the algae being parasitic on coral reefs and helping them gain nutrition leave them. Coral reefs therefore are bleaching in today's age. They live with less and less marine organisms. Hence, marine biodiversity is being menaced by climate change with the rising temperature.

Except that, one of the most paramount ways of how climate change intimidates marine biodiversity is changing the pH of seawater. By the emission of greenhouse gasses, it is ubiquitous to cause a reaction of dissolving CO2 into seawater. Seawater is made more acidic by doing that increasingly. Coral reefs cannot live in the sea with the condition of that. As a result, marine organisms are going to decrease rather than increase.

As the professor said in the interview, "Climate change impacts each person and individual measures can also save the environment." For individual measures, people should bring their own shopping bags whenever people go shopping and use as few plastic bags as possible. For the government, the Environmental Protection Department is advised to step up environmental education. And for society, it should be aware of the need to reduce carbon footprint. The real challenge lies in how we, as inhabitants of Mother Earth can nurse it back to health and make our world a better place for both marine and terrestrial organisms to live in. It requires taking considerate, consistent and compassionate actions to save this world, not just for ourselves but for all lives on Earth and the generation yet to come.

Write an essay on whether or not you agree that giant pandas be used for diplomatic purposes, particularly in light of mistreatment allegations in some zoos.

Pandas: The World's Treasure

Pandas are the 'national treasure' of China and are well-known worldwide, boasting an impressive fan base hailing from diverse nations, including Japan, Korea, and the UK. These countries have applied for custody of pandas from the Chinese government with the ambition to attract visitors and generate significant revenue through the display of these beloved animals.

Pandas owe their global popularity to their adorable appearance. Their black circled eyes enhance their endearing looks. They are also quite cuddly with a fur mix of snow-white and black-marble. Their fat bodies and round faces make them irresistible, giving everyone the desire to hug and squeeze them.

These charming natives of Sichuan province in China are the superstars of the zoos worldwide. For instance, the Sichuan Zoo attracts over 900 thousand visitors each year. The Everland Zoo in Korea has lured 5.4 million visitors from 2021 to February 2024, with pandas taking the centre stage. Furthermore, at Ueno Zoo in Tokyo, Japan, thousands of people are reduced to tears just from catching a glimpse of these glorious creatures. Additionally, Ueno Zoo merchandises all sorts of panda-themed items, such as postcards, stickers, and dolls with customers clamouring for anything bearing a panda logo.

Though pandas are coveted for zoos worldwide, care standards can vary significantly. For instance, pandas in Japan receive commendable treatment. They are provided with fresh bamboo, and a forest-like environment is maintained to offer them space for rest.

Regrettably, not every panda is treated with the same level of care. Last year, a Chinese news outlet reported two pandas, named Le Le and Ya Ya, who were based at the Memphis Zoo in the United States, were subjected to poor treatment. Both were emaciated and displayed a weak, fatigued demeanour. Consequently, the Chinese government liaised with the zoo to repatriate Le Le and Ya Ya to China.

The author of the news article expresses their concern about pandas being used for diplomatic purposes and proposes that the Chinese government should abstain from loaning pandas to other countries. This proposal aims to mitigate scenarios where pandas could be mistreated due to insufficient resources or used for scientific experimentation. Such arrangement might endanger their survival, given the dwindling panda population, currently calculated to stand at around 2,060 globally.

Hence, I must agree with the writer that China should be mindful on who they loan pandas to because pandas are valued treasures to protect. Pandas need to continue to multiply and thrive in the future. But I disagree that China should completely abstain from loaning out pandas because they are regarded as symbols of peace and friendship in Chinese culture. So the Chinese government must have strict rules and regulations for those that receive these magnificent animals, and be stern in administering diplomatic consequences to those nations that do not follow them.

In conclusion, China must be more discriminating when loaning out pandas, but it will require an international commitment to their care and conservation, ensuring they are never mistreated or lost forever.

While there may be some negative aspects to online learning, the benefits certainly outweigh any possible problems. Online learning isn't perfect, and potential complications such as a bad internet connection and lack of discipline might occur. However, there are multiple reasons why online learning is a good and convenient method for learning. It offers various resources and can be more interesting. It also saves money and gives more time to rest.

Of course not everything is perfect. Online learning does have some disadvantages. At times, there might be a poor internet connection or the Wi-Fi might fail, which can hinder learning. For instance, students might miss a class due to an unstable internet connection, and until the internet is working again, they cannot participate in the class. Also setting up the technology can be time-consuming. Teachers may be unfamiliar with the tech, resulting in a slow start to classes making the teaching less effective.

Furthermore, some students might lack discipline. They struggle to work independently and require external motivation to complete their assignments. In physical classrooms, if students don't pay attention, teachers can discipline them and ensure that they complete their work. In contrast, when teaching online, teachers aren't in the same physical space to monitor the students, giving them less control over the students' work production. Thus, online learning requires motivation and discipline for successful independent study.

The added rest reduces feelings of tiredness and drowsiness during lessons as some students tend to fall asleep in 'face-to-face' classes due to the lack of sleep.

Lessons are also more engaging with online classes. There are many elements that make online learning more enjoyable. For instance, teachers can use PowerPoint presentations and online games to enhance learning. Students may also develop a greater interest in subjects they find boring or difficult to grasp in face-to-face classes. For example, students can get a more in-depth understanding of the teacher's online lectures through the many interactive features present in learning applications that are usually prohibited in an in-person class. For online English classes, students can use the app called 'i-solution' for e-books. For online Math classes, students can use 'Photomath' for problems they don't know how to solve. These apps assist students with detailed explanations and translations.


My thrilling trip to Beijing
